Fanu,2018-02-27 Sheridan Le Fanu was born at No 45 Lower Dominick Street Dublin into a literary family of Huguenot origins Both his grandmother Alicia Sheridan Le Fanu and his great uncle Richard Brinsley Sheridan were playwrights His niece Rhoda Broughton would become a very successful novelist Within a year of his birth his family moved to the Royal Hibernian Military School in Phoenix Park where his father an Anglican clergyman was the chaplain of the establishment Phoenix Park and the adjacent village and parish church of Chapelizod were to feature in Le Fanu's later stories Le Fanu studied law at Trinity College in Dublin where he was elected Auditor of the College Historical Society He was called to the bar in 1839 but he never practised and soon abandoned law for journalism In 1838 he began contributing stories to the Dublin University Magazine including his first ghost story entitled *A Strange Event in the Life of Schalken the Painter* 1839 He became owner of several newspapers from 1840 including the *Dublin Evening Mail* and the *Warder* **CARMILLA, Special Illustrated Edition** J.
