

Parent Quick Start Guide to Twinkl Phonics Minibooks



The Twinkl Phonics minibooks build on skills taught in the Twinkl Phonics Programme. They follow the learning objectives of EYF and EYF-ESF while helping your child to practice and apply their new phonics knowledge to read and write.

Key terms we use in this guide

- Phoneme:** sometimes called 'sound', the smallest sound in a word (e.g. /t/ and /a/ and /t/ make the word 'cat')
- Grapheme:** letters that represent phonemes (e.g. the phoneme /t/ is written as 't' or 'tt' as in 'tall')
- Digraph:** two letters that represent one phoneme (e.g. 'ch', 'sh', 'ai')
- Trigraph:** three letters that represent one phoneme (e.g. 'igh', 'air')
- Adjacent Grapheme:** letters next to each other in a word that make that word (e.g. 'ea' in 'beach') but are sometimes difficult to hear separately (e.g. 'ea' in 'beach', 'ea' in 'space')
- Sound Substitution:** when the letters and their order make that other two phonemes are represented (e.g. 'at' 'dog')
- Phonics Knowledge Progression Map:** shows the words that need to be learned and when they are first introduced. Some of these words can be extended and some children learn hard-core words in Level 1 only.

What Do the Reading Minibooks Look Like?

Each minibook has four that is carefully matched to the stories that your children love reading. In this way, through the Twinkl Phonics Programme, the minibooks get more challenging to match their developing skills.

Level 1

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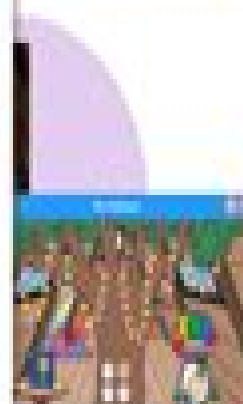
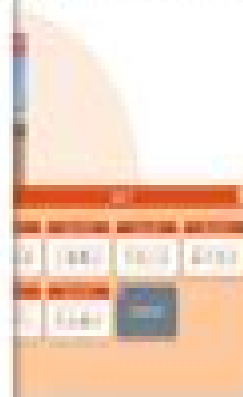
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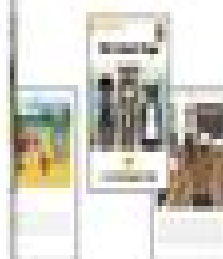
