Davis,2000 He remembers lying awake at night every muscle rigidly alert listening for intruders He remembers frantically hammering on the door while his mother s oblivious footsteps passed back and forth inside He remembers acting as a go between in the marketplace the doctor s office the parent teacher conference the synagogue the post office a liaison between sound and
