After an excellent overview chapter that introduces the main theories of career development and outlines many of the factors that affect career development chapters 2 and 3 focus on the use of assessment in career counseling. Chapter 2 in particular provides numerous insights into the contribution psychological tests make to career counseling but not without making it clear that testing has its limitations. It is probably the best short introductory chapter on psychological testing that I have read. In particular it offers very useful guidelines as to what best practicing in testing involves. The book must have been thoroughly revised since the great majority of the references mentioned in the text post date that edition. Jennifer M. Kidd in British Journal of Guidance and Counselling Providing a comprehensive approach to career counseling this volume integrates the career counseling process into the life span ranging from early childhood through older adulthood. For each stage the author explores emotional physical and mental development factors. The author also provides suggestions, techniques and case studies for counseling clients at each of these stages. Two chapters cover the uses and types of various assessment instruments a critique of the instruments applicability to the counseling process is also included. Using a life span framework the author also discusses years of identification and differentiation years of growth and searching years of realism and separation years of compromise and commitment to a lifestyle and more. The book closes with a case analysis suitable for class work in career development or related course.
