## Wind-Chill

- $30^{\circ}$  is *chilly* and may be *uncomfortable*
- $15^{\circ}$  to  $30^{\circ}$  is *cold*
- $0^{\circ}$  to  $15^{\circ}$  is *very cold*
- $-20^{\circ}$  to  $0^{\circ}$  is *bitter cold* with significant risk of *frostbite*
- $-20^{\circ}$  to  $-60^{\circ}$  is *extreme cold* and *frostbite* is likely

## Heat Index



- 78° or below is considered *comfortable*
- 85° beginning to feel *uncomfortable*
- 90° *uncomfortable* and may be *hazardous*
- 100° considered *dangerous*
