Section IV. Directions

Individual Directions: Place the Drawing Form in the portrait orientation in front of the examinee along with a pencil with an eraser. Say, I want you to draw a picture of yourself. Be sure to draw your whole body, not just your head, and draw how you look from the front, not from the side. Do not draw a cartoon or stick figure. Draw the very best picture of yourself that you can. Take your time and work carefully. Go ahead.

If the examinee draws a side view or only a head, repeat the instructions. A new Drawing Form may be provided if needed or requested. The examinee may erase as needed, but do not prompt the examinee to do so. However, if the examinee asks if it is okay to erase, respond in the affirmative.

Group Directions: Pass out the Drawing Forms to all examinees and demonstrate placement of the sheet in a portrait orientation. Be sure each examinee has a pencil with an eraser. Say, I want you to draw a picture of yourself. Be sure to draw your whole body, not just your head, and draw how you look from the front, not from the side. Do not draw a cartoon or stick figure. Draw the very best picture of yourself that you can. Take your time and work carefully. Now go ahead. Raise your hand if you have a question or when you complete your drawing.

Be sure to walk among the group and inspect the drawings. If an examinee is observed to draw a side view or only a head, repeat the instructions softly to the examinee. A new Drawing Form may be provided if needed or requested. Examinees may erase as needed, but do not prompt them to do so. However, if an examinee asks if it is okay to erase, respond in the affirmative. Once an examinee completes the drawing, be sure the name or ID number is on the Drawing Form, then collect the drawing. Do not wait to collect all the drawings at once.
