5 STEPS TO PERFORMING CPR

1 ASSESS SCENE SAFETY



Check your surroundings for safety. If you are in danger, call 9-1-1 first.

2 CHECK FOR RESPONSIVENESS



Ask, "Are you okay?" Tap other person's shoulder and shout, "Are you okay?"

3 LOOK FOR NORMAL BREATHING



Look for normal chest rise and fall.

4 CALL 9-1-1



If no response, call 9-1-1. If you are alone, start CPR immediately. If someone else is available, have them call 9-1-1 and get an AED if available.

5 START CPR



Use compressions and rescue breaths.


5 CONTINUE ABDOMINAL THRUSTS UNTIL:

1 GIVE 30 CHEST COMPRESSIONS



2 GIVE 2 RESCUE BREATHS



3 GIVE CHEST COMPRESSIONS



4 STEPS: HOW TO HELP A CONSCIOUS CHILD



5 CONTINUE ABDOMINAL THRUSTS UNTIL:

This action is forced out.
The abdominal area coughs forcefully or becomes quiet.
The person begins to breathe on their own.
You are too exhausted to continue.

INFANT

STEP 1: HOW TO PERFORM (INFANTS - 1 MO - 1 YR)

1 GIVE 30 CHEST COMPRESSIONS



2 GIVE 2 RESCUE BREATHS



3 STEPS: HOW TO HELP A CONSCIOUS INFANT



4 GIVE 5 BACK BLOWS



5 GIVE 5 CHEST THRUSTS



6 CONTINUE SETS OF 5 BACK BLOWS AND 5 CHEST THRUSTS UNTIL:

This action is forced out.
The abdominal area coughs forcefully or becomes quiet.
The person begins to breathe on their own.
You are too exhausted to continue.

1 CHECK FOR BREATHING AND A PULSE




2 IF NO PULSE, START CPR
